

REPORT ERASMUS+ MOBILITY TENERIFI, CANARIAN ISLAND, SPAIN

In this report students attending The Ljubljana Secondary School for Hairstyling will present their mobility project in Tenerife, Spain.

Tenerife is the biggest most populated from all the 7 islands.

This island has the most popular carnival in Spain.

On the island there is also a volcano called "El Teide" which is located at 3718m above sea level. It's the 3rd biggest volcano in the world.
